






Worm resistance in sheep

Choosing the right wormer

Selecting the appropriate wormer can be challenging due to the number and variety of products available.

The aim is to select an appropriate wormer that will kill the parasites that are present and not to pick one for which resistance has developed. If resistance has developed, do not use the same active substance as this will worsen the problem. Different brands may contain the same active substance, so switching brands does not guarantee a different ingredient.

To help you choose the right chemical class of wormers to use, the active substances are divided into five categories. The category is shown on the product label and package leaflet using specific symbols. If resistance is found in one class, switch to an active substance from another class. For further advice, contact your veterinary practitioner.
