Tell your doctor right away if you develop any of the signs or symptoms listed below. Prompt medical treatment can prevent problems from becoming more serious and reduce your symptoms. Your doctor may give you other medicines to treat your symptoms, withhold the next dose or stop treatment with LOQTORZI.

IMPORTANT

- Keep this Patient Alert Card with you all the time during the treatment period and for four (4) months after the last LOQTORZI injection.
- Show this Patient Alert Card to any healthcare professional involved in your medical care or if you go to the emergency department.
- If you have any questions, consult a doctor or nurse about your treatment. Do not attempt to diagnose or treat side effects yourself.

- Read the LOQTORZI package leaflet or consult your doctor for more information about the side effects of LOQTORZI.

Immune-related adverse reactions
LOQTORZI treatment may increase the risk of immune-related adverse reactions. Important immune-related adverse reactions and the associated symptoms are listed below.

Seek urgent medical attention if you have any of the following signs or symptoms, or if they get worse:

Lungs

- Chest pain or coughing
- Shortness of breath

Liver

- Pain on the right side of stomach
- Yellowing of skin or whites of eyes (jaundice)

- Dark urine
- Bleeding or bruising more easily than normal
- Nausea or vomiting, feeling less hungry

Intestines

- Diarrhoea or more bowel movements than usual
- Stools that are black, tarry, sticky or contain blood or mucus
- Severe stomach pain or tenderness

Kidneys

- Changes in the amount or colour of your urine

Hormone glands

- Rapid heartbeat
- Muscle aches or pain
- Weight loss or weight gain
- Feeling cold
- Constipation
- Dizziness or fainting
- Headaches that will not go away or unusual headache

- Increased sweating
- Hair loss, deeper voice

Type 1 diabetes

- Feeling more hungry or thirsty
- Needing to urinate more often
- Weight loss
- Feeling tired or feeling sick, stomach pain, fast and deep breathing, confusion, unusual sleepiness, a sweet smell to your breath, a sweet or metallic taste in your mouth, or a different odour to your urine or sweat

Heart

- chest pain, irregular heartbeat, palpitations
- Shortness of breath, feeling tired

Skin

- Rash, itching, peeling, or sores
- Ulcers in mouth or in lining of nose, throat, or genital area
- Skin blistering
